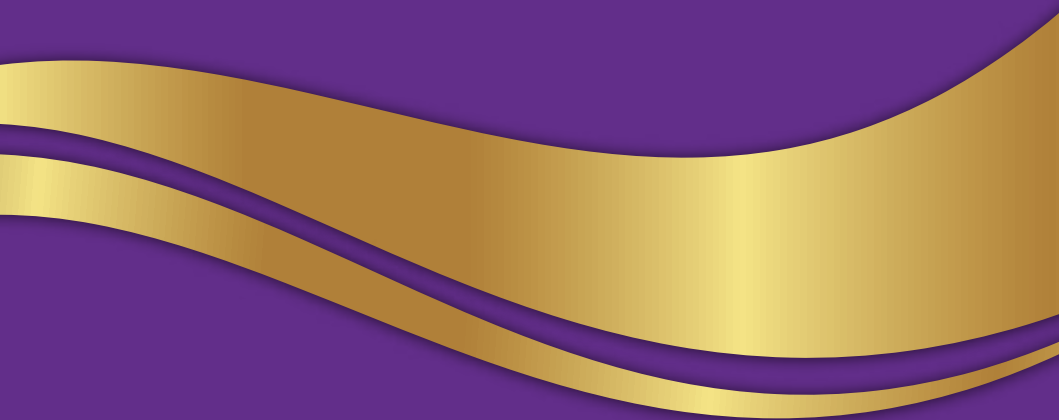

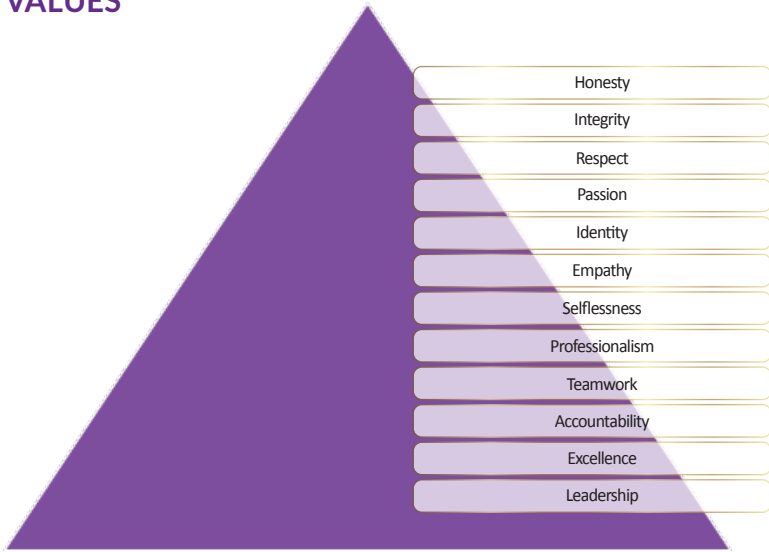
MISSION
